## Your Preschooler is Wonderfully Made

## HELP YOUR PRESCHOOLER GROW CLOSER TO GOD

1. **Ignite their imagination**. *(Don't fight it.)* When it comes to details, they often embellish and confuse. If they want a monkey in the manger scene, let them have a monkey! **Fo**cus on the WONDER of Jesus being born rather than correcting them.

2. Activate their senses. They think like artists. Turn a Bible verse into a song, tell a story with hand motions, watch a video on the Bible App for Kids, eat bread and fish sticks, don't create more smells.

3. Structure helps them feel safe enough to imagine and wonder about their Creator. Schedule short times throughout the day that they will routinely know to experience God. Pray at the traffic light before preschool, point out what God made on walks, read bedtime devotions.

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
